


Speaker: Jim Roberts

Monthly Quick Tip from Your Growers Clinic Team



September 9th is generally considered to be the "mid-point of the hurricane season". By now, we would have experienced those frequent afternoon thunderstorms, perhaps a rain-laden Tropical Depression, but, hopefully, not a hurricane! Things are just damp and soggy! That dampness creates PRIME harborage for bacteria and fungus, especially the dreaded "crown rot", that often signals the demise of a plant.

One way to combat this is to religiously (every 2 weeks!) spray your plants (yes, flowers, blossoms, leaves, pseudobulbs, pots, etc.) with a good fungicide made for orchids. There are a few, and Physan 20 is one of them. The key ingredients to watch for are the "quaternary ammonium chlorides" which should add up to 20%., hence "Physan 20' or "RD 20", etc. At that strength, they're used at 1 teaspoon per gallon for maintenance, and 2 tsps per gallon if you are treating confirmed cases of crown rot. A word to the wise... Unlike interest rates, the number of orchids in our collection, or the number of grandchildren we've been blessed with, using MORE than the RECOMMENDED DILUTION is NOT better, and can actually be deleterious to your orchids! These products are available at most garden centers and, of course, from Amazon. A pint (16 oz) bottle makes 96 gallons for "maintenance", and, as they are liquids, are easily dispensed in your hose-end sprayer.

Jay Loeffler Photo Composition Tips Continued from Last Month

Photo Composition Tip 6: Use diagonals

Horizontal lines lend a static, calm feel to a picture, while vertical ones often suggest stability. To create a feeling of drama, movement or uncertainty, look for diagonal lines instead.

You can need nothing more than a shift in position or focal length to get them – wider angles of view tend to introduce diagonal lines because of the increased perspective; with wide-angle lenses you're more likely to tilt the camera up or down to get more of a scene in.

You can also introduce diagonal lines artificially, using the 'Dutch Tilt' technique. You simply tilt the camera as you take the shot. This can be very effective, though it doesn't suit every shot and is best used sparingly

- 1. Wide-angle lens creates diagonal lines automatically.
- 2. Low viewpoints make you tilt the camera upwards, which will strengthen diagonals.



Photo Composition Tip 7: Backgrounds

Don't just concentrate on your subject – look at what's happening in the background. This will tie in with simplifying the scene and filling the frame. You can't usually exclude the background completely, of course, but you can control it.

You'll often find that changing your position is enough to replace a cluttered background with one that complements your subject nicely. Or you can use a wide lens aperture and a longer focal length to throw the background out of focus.

It all depends on whether the background is part of the story you're trying to tell with the photo. In the shot below, the background is something that needs to be suppressed.

- 1. Use longer focal points to throw backgrounds out of focus.
- 2. Fill the frame the less space taken up with background the better.
