

On Wednesday, November 13, Rick Belisle and the Growers Clinic Team offered a dual program on <u>Preparing Your Orchids for Winter</u> and <u>Preparing Your Orchids for Shows</u>. Approximately 20 members and guests attended. Many were observed taking notes as well as photos of some of the various slides in the presentation. Because of the interaction, suggestions and experiences exchanged between the attendees, there was plenty of "knowledge transfer" at this meeting! Of particular interest was the slide depicting the tolerable temperature ranges of various Cattleyas. Some no lower than 64° while others as low as 34°!. There was also an excellent discussion and overview on preparing for the upcoming shows, the first of which is in January! Your blooming plants are needed to create our display. We will collect and transport your plants to the show and ensure their safe return to you on Monday following the show.

Look for a return email confirming your plant registration with a number to attach to your plant. This will facilitate display set up at the show.

Plants should be cleaned, staked, free of pests and disease

Plants should be labeled with the plant name, the owner's name and the plant registration number provided when you register your plant

Flowers should be in prime condition to last through the weekend show. Please water your plants thoroughly and place in a box or container for transport to the show.

DECEMBER

- Water well, as needed, when dry.
- Protect cold-sensitive genera.
- Supplement potassium and magnesium for winter health.



And, of course, cleaning up your growing area and plants by remove dead leaves helps keeping your plants healthy. This should be done throughout the year as needed.

Let There Be Light

As mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter, one of the presentations in the November 13 Growers centered on Preparing Your Orchids for Shows. A discussion ensued regarding temperatures for encouraging plants to spike, the reference being that Phals require a 10-15 degree temperature change to encourage spiking. One of our members, Irene Bozogan, asked the question, "besides phals, what other orchids require those temperature variances to encourage them to spike?" Great question! A look around the room, and at the blank faces, resulted in the answer, "We don't know but we'll find out!"

So, using various syntax for questions in our trusty Google search engine resulted in some quite startling information! At first, we came up with, of course, the popular theorem having to do with the temperature changes, which would satisfy most people. However, Irene then asked the question "what about Ecuador, for instance? They are so close to the equator as to have very little temperature change. How does that affect the outcome? What about wet and dry seasons?" This, naturally, led to yet more searching.

Interestingly, Ecuador has over 4,000 species of native orchids, and has, along with Columbia, more orchids per square meter than any other country in the world! Now that is not only interesting, but begs to yet other questions. Ecuador has a coastline ("sea level") and also shares in the Andes Mountains, with heights of up to 15,500 feet! How does *that* figure into the equation? According to the information I found, even with the variances in elevation, the temperatures at a given elevation only vary by between 12 and 15 degrees on any day. This may explain why Ecuador, and also Columbia, have so many orchids in bloom at any one time.

But, where does the amount of daylight enter the equation? Is it the "intensity" or the "length of daylight" that is the key? Certainly, as here in the US, winter days have less daylight than summer days, regardless of whether the location is above or below the equator.

Then, to try and answer the questions, I went to the old stand-by, the AOS. As it turns out the AOS states that, all other things being equal and relative, i.e., there is sufficient food, water/moisture and air (that made me think of that acronym we use in our Orchids – 101 class, F-L-A-W), the true requirement for determining if, or when, a given orchid will begin the flowering cycle is the amount of available light that that particular orchid species requires! Said, another way, even if a given orchid has the correct amounts of air, food and water, unless the "minimum light requirements" for that orchid are met, it will not bloom. Hence, and we've all read it or heard it or said it, when a member brings their plant to the Orchid ER and asks, "I've done everything...fed it, watered it, I have fans moving air yet it won't bloom!", the answer most often given is, "it needs more light". I would venture to say that the correct answer should now be, "it needs the correct amount of light necessary to bloom." Let there be light!
