

Your Blooming Plants Are Needed!

VAOS Annual Orchid Show & Sale

Our annual show is just two weeks away! A key component of our show is the elaborate exhibits constructed by society display teams and composed of member plants that AOS judges evaluate to award ribbons and trophies for the best orchids. If you have a blooming plant in prime condition during the show weekend please enter your plant. You will help our display team build a quality exhibit and you may bring home an award for your plant!

All plants must be registered in advance via email between Sunday January 26th and Wednesday January 29st.

Email your plant name with a photo of the flower or color description and <u>flower</u> size to <u>PlantReg@VAOS.org</u>. Include your phone number.

Look for a return email confirming your plant registration with an entry number. Attach your name and this number to the side of your orchid pot. This will facilitate display set up and take down at the show.

Bring your plants to the Venice Community Center on Friday, January 31st, between <u>12pm – 1pm</u>. Enter through the <u>rear entrance</u> and you will be directed to the plant drop off area.

Pick up your plants on Sunday, February 2nd, at 4:15pm at the VAOS exhibit.

Plants should be cleaned, staked, free of pests and disease

Plants should be labeled with the plant name, owner's name and plant entry number

Flowers should be in prime condition to last through the weekend show. Please water your plants thoroughly.

VAOS SHOW INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

All volunteers should enter through the rear entrance. Michele or Steve will verify your assignment from our list and provide directions. Please wear your name tag.

Show **t-shirts** will be distributed from the Membership Table to VAOS members who volunteer their time to work at our show. (**Please be sure your membership is up to date**).

Your committee chair will have **instructions** for your assignment when you arrive. Please read them carefully before starting your assignment.

HOW TO PREPARE YOUR PLANT FOR THE SHOW

Groom Your Plant:

Remove dead or brown leaves and pseudobulbs from the plant. Clean the pseudobulbs and leaves (water helps to soften the dry papery covering around pseudobulbs so that you can gently rub it off). Trim dead areas from leaves. Cut following the basic shape of the natural leaf ending if possible.

Wipe the top of the leaves (vinegar, lemon juice, sprite, 7 up, etc.) to remove residue. Do not use commercial spray to shine the leaves.

Make sure the media in the container is clean. Remove trash, debris, dead leaves or stems and weeds from the pot.

Pests or Diseases:

While prepping orchids for a display, check for pests and disease. Check the leaves and pseudobulbs for a white cottony substance, an indication of mealybugs. Hard, whitish bumps may mean scale and if any are found remove them with alcohol and a Q-tip. If there is a bad infestation, do not bring the plant to the show. Check for other pests such as snails, slugs and ants. Inspect the flowers for thrips and other damage. If a flower is marred by spots it is better to leave the plant at home.

Stakes:

Carefully stake the spike that will present the flowers to their best advantage. If you can plan ahead of time, it is best to stake the spike as it emerges; an older spike is harder and can break off easier.

These are often needed to support the flower spike but should not distract the eye. Keep them looking as natural as possible. Stakes should not protrude beyond the top of the last bloom flower, but should allow the flowers to be kept away from the foliage. It may also protect the flower spike from damage during travel to the show.

Remove any wire hangers, hoops, etc. Water each plant thoroughly before bringing to the show. If the plant is in a plastic pot, drop it into a clay pot for stability. Place each plant carefully in a large box or container for transport. To keep the plants from moving around you can put rolled newspapers around the pots.

Labels:

Ensure your plant has its name tag. Also tape a piece of masking tape with your name on it to the side of pot. This is how the Team knows the plant owner so it will be returned to you. All plants must be registered in advance via email prior to setup day See Plant Registration Instructions.

ORCHID BOUTIQUE WOULD LIKE YOUR GREENS

for our 'Living Color' Arrangements

Interesting or colorful foliage brings more sales for Boutique floral arrangements during the show. If you have something interesting or **colorful** please share it with Orchid Boutique. Hardy, long-lasting greens such as: mini palm fronds, croton, ti, and ginger leaves are great design elements. How about some ferns, ivy, papyrus stems? A handful of <u>Short to Medium</u> stalks work best, as most containers are 12" or less.

Please enter the back doors by the kitchen with your greens on **Friday, January 31** from 11:00 - 4:00 or **Saturday, February 1** from 9:00 to noon. Orchid Boutique is across from the kitchen.

The foliage should be in a container--bucket, gallon milk jug, plastic cup, etc. -- that has some water in it. Any container with a name on it will be returned to you.

The Orchid Boutique has been an important component of our annual show for the past 25 years. Talented volunteers create and sell orchid arrangements in collectible containers as well as other orchid accessories. They also create orchid bouquets that we give to handicapped quests at our show.

<u>The rules</u>: Orchids must be the dominant subject of all items submitted. Each item should be properly prepared for exhibition (framed, mounted, etc.). Contributors must be members of VAOS or a member of an orchid society participating in this show. Submissions will be screened prior to display and trophy or ribbons may be awarded at the judges' discretion. Art pieces previously winning prizes at a VAOS show are welcome to be displayed in exhibit but will not be judged. Judges may redefine classes based on entries submitted.

<u>How to Enter</u>: Bring your artwork to the community center on Friday, January 31st between 1pm and 3pm. Enter through the rear door, check in, and proceed to the left side of the stage. Arts & Crafts staff will assist you in registering your artwork.

Don't forget to bring easels or display stands, labeled with your name, if required for display.

You may enter up to three (3) items

VAOS Show Hosts will be stationed nearby to discourage guests from touching artwork

Items may be sold but may not be removed from the display until the end of the show on Sunday. **Pick up your artwork at 4:15pm on Sunday.**

FEBRUARY

- Light Watering should be done in the morning hours.
- · Caution, not out of the cold yet!
- Treat with recommended fungicide.
- Look for plants needing repotting.

And, of course, cleaning up your growing area and plants by removing dead leaves helps keep your plants healthy. This should be done throughout the year as needed.
