Rick Belisle has been growing

orchids since 2009 when, in a meeting of the Newcomers of Venice, he heard, during a presentation by our own Carol Wood, that "orchids offer you the opportunity to have color year round." Intrigued by that statement, he approached Carol and she, after some discussion, suggested he come to the next VAOS meeting. At that meeting, he joined the Venice Area Orchid Society to learn more about orchids and how to grow them. Now, after many trials and tribulations, he has approximately 100 orchids in his collection. They include Dendrobiums (his personal favorite!), Cattleyas, Oncidiums, Catasetums, Stanhopeas, and a few Phaleonopsis.

He is an active member of the VAOS, is the Mentoring Program Coordinator for the club, as well as the Director of Education, Training and Outreach. He has taught classes on orchids and orchid care in orchid shows and to orchid clubs, garden clubs, and to many other service clubs. During our annual Show and Sale he is our Master of Ceremonies, welcoming our guests, reading off the hourly raffle winners, and teaching our classes.

His presentation will be not only for new members, but also more "seasoned" members, who might just wonder (or forget!) exactly what it is we, the Venice Area Orchid Society, are all about. The discussion will cover the Who, What, Where, How and When of all that we do....and the list, after putting it all together, and as you'll see, is quite extensive!



Monthly Quick Tip from Your Growers Clinic Team



MARCH

- Preventive spray for Thrips.
- Repot your dormant plants: catasetums, calanthes, and soft cane dendrobiums.
- Repotting of cattleyas, oncidiums, hard cane dendrobiums, etc. continues.
- Watch lighting as the sun gets higher creating longer growing days.

And, of course, cleaning up your growing area and plants by removing dead leaves helps keep your plants healthy. This should be done throughout the year as needed.

What's In A Tag?

So, you've bought an orchid(or three), and you're wondering what all that gibberish on the tag really means, I'm going to try to explain it here.

Generally the tag has at least two words, the first of which is often abbreviated. This is the genus, ex. Brassavola, Phalaenopsis, Cattleya, etc. This tells you what type of orchid you have. In the case of hybrids between two genera, the first is often abbreviated. I won't go into all the abbreviations, as it takes up about 8 pages on some of the websites I've looked at. The easiest way to discover what the abbreviations mean is a simple google search.

Which brings me to part two of your tag. If your orchid is a species, or as it may occur in nature, the next part will begin with a lowercase letter. For example, Brassavola nodosa, or Cattleya violacea. If it's a hybrid, each part will be capitalized. For example, Phalaenopsis Jennifer Palermo, or Cattleya Horace. If it is an unnamed hybrid, you will see the names of the two parent plants.

And sometimes, there is a part three, which is the cultivar name, capitalized with single quotation marks. Any clone or division of this plant carries the cultivar name. For example, Bc. Yellow Bird 'FLSO'.

And now to the reason I decided to write this in the first place. What are all the letters after some of those orchid names? Awards, generally from the American Orchid Society. The American Orchid Society awards are given to plants and flowers of exceptional quality. The one I see most often is AM/AOS, awarded to orchid species or hybrids scoring 80 to 89 points inclusive on a 100-point scale.


Others are HCC (Highly Commended Certificate), awarded to orchid species or hybrids scoring 75 to 79 points inclusive on a 100-point scale.

FCC (First Class Certificate), the highest flower-quality award, awarded to orchid species or hybrids scoring 90 points or more on a 100-point scale.

CCM (Certificate of Cultural Merit), awarded to the exhibitor of a well-flowered specimen plant of robust health. The plant must have been in the care of the exhibitor at least 12 months immediately prior to the award and must score between 80 and 89 points inclusive on a 100-point scale.

CCE (Certificate of Cultural Excellence), awarded to the exhibitor of a well-flowered specimen plant of robust health. The plant must have been in the care of the exhibitor at least 12 months immediately prior to the award and must score at least 90 points on a 100-point scale. Plants receiving this award represent the highest level of orchid culture.

I hope this clears some things up. It sure would have been nice to have this when I was starting out. But what I did have was the Venice Area Orchid Society, and all the collective knowledge. So if you are a new member: welcome and enjoy!
